# Basketball

The school's Senior and under 16 basketball teams can report a fantastic term of competition again this year, with both teams topping the Wexford League groups with an unbeaten streak. The girls' commitment to training has paid dividends as they trained twice weekly sharpening their skills and tactics.

**Under 16**: The key to any team's success is commitment and teamwork. This was epitomised by the under 16 team in their march to the South East Final to be held on 11<sup>th</sup> December in Mercy Waterford. The girls got their season underway with comprehensive home victories over Colaiste Bride and Bridgetown while winning away to Loreto Wexford in very blustery outdoor conditions. These fine wins saw the girls finish top of the league section. In the guarter finals the girls had home advantage to Borris Vocational School,

and overcame the visitors on a scoreline of 37 to 17. Next up was FCJ Bunclody in the semifinal played at home. Presentation stamped their authority on the game and turned out a truly magnificent team performance to power their way to an impressive 48 points to 16 points victory, advancing to the South East Final on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> December, where they meet Presentation Waterford.

#### Transition Year News - September to December '09

The Transition Year students have had an extremely busy time since the return to school last September. They began their year with a "group-bonding" session in Sheilbaggan Outdoor Adventure Centre in Ramsgrange, where they enjoyed team challenges. Despite the appalling weather conditions, the girls enjoyed the chance to get to know each other.

On the 2<sup>nd</sup> of October, all the students participated in a "Personal Development Day." Added to this, last month, the students let their imaginations do the talking, when they participated in the "Matrix Day." They also developed their artistic side, when they took part in a "Flower Arranging" workshop, where the girls got to individually design their own flower-basket.

As part of Transition Year, all students are offered the opportunity to participate in the Gaisce Awards - the President's Awards. This allows students to participate in community work, learn a new skill and participate in a physical activity for a set number of weeks. An adventure trip is also a requirement of the awards. On the 22<sup>nd</sup> October, the girls set out with Ms Larkin, Mr Rolston and Mr McCormack to Glendalough, Co. Wicklow, on a 25km walk over two days, with an overnight stay in An Óige Hostel in Glendalough. A great time was had by all students! Many thanks are given to Mr McCormack for offering his time and effort in working out the walk-route for the students.

Since mid-September, T. Y. 1 students have been doing their work-experience placement every Wednesday. All the girls are extremely grateful to their employers for offering them this wonderful opportunity to experience life in the working-world. T. Y. 2 students begin their work-experience placement at the end of January.

The girls are also extremely busy with their "Mini-Company" course. In groups of 3-5, students set up their own enterprises. The school is the base market, with some companies working outside of school as well. A diverse range of products/services are now being made available to students, in the school, by the companies. More information on this in the New Year . . .

New to the Transition Year programme this year is the "Young Social Innovators" course. We are delighted to be the first and only school in Wexford town to offer this course to its students. Y. S. I. is a social awareness and education in action course for 15-18 year olds which heightens students' knowledge of pressing social issues. All the students are very busy in the development of their respective group projects. T. Y. 1 students are working on their project: "Quid Pro Quo - Teenage Consumer Respect" and T. Y. 2 students are busy with their own project: "G. A. A. - Girls Also Aloud." The New Year promises to be a busy time for the girls so watch this space!

Another major part of T. Y. is the annual drama production. This year's play is John Millington Synge's "The Playboy of the Western World." Set in the west of Ireland, at the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, it tells the story of the rogue stranger Christy Mahon trying to impress the locals with his wild ways. The performances take place on Tuesday and Wednesday, the 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> of December, with three in-school productions and one evening (public) production on the 16th. A raffle will be held at each performance. All the funds generated from these performances goes to help the T. Y. year and events. Work on the play has been ongoing since September and the girls have worked extremely hard, so well done to all involved.

On November 26<sup>th</sup>, the girls participated in the "Road Safety Workshop" at the Wexford Youths Football Grounds – an eye-opening educational experience for all involved.
