

In a hotly contested final the girls emerged deserving winners on a scoreline of 3-5 to 2-3. However it was not until the last quarter that the girls confirmed their earlier dominance. Ballyhale were quickest out of the blocks and took an early lead thanks to a brace of points from their classy centre forward. Corner forward Geraldine Doolan opened the Presentation's account with a goal when she latched on to a long ball and got the deftest of flicks to guide into the Ballyhale net. The Presentation fired over two quick points, compliments of Ciara Rossiter and Mary O Rourke. Ballyhale struck their third point before the referee's whistle drew a close to a closely contested first half.

Presentation girls hit full stride early in the second half and in a ten minutes purple patch they struck 1 goal and 3 points. A goal from Aleisha Cullen and fine solo efforts from Ciara Rossiter and Lauren Nugent saw the Presentation take a commanding lead. However Ballyhale's reply was immediate with a goal of their own. With ten minutes remaining on the clock, the Presentation scored their third goal. An emphatic ground stroke from Aishling Earle sent the ball crashing into the roof of the net. Ballyhale managed a late consolation goal but it was the Slaneysiders who emerged victorious to claim the Leinster Minor C camogie Title.


